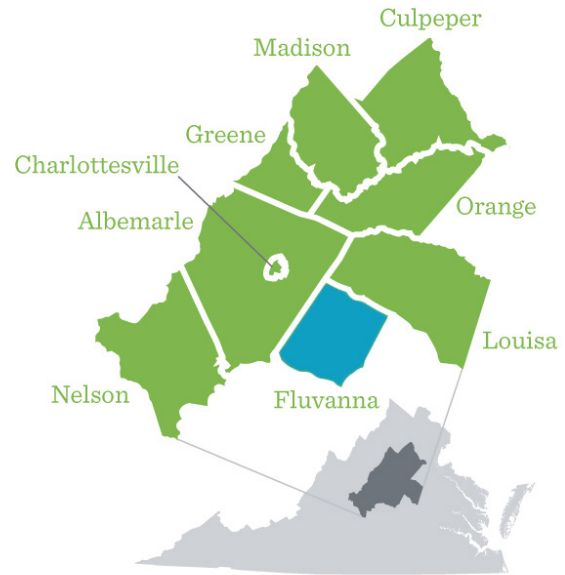

- Local employers draw from a substantial labor force with a high degree of training from nearby institutions of higher learning. The availability of shopping, cultural, and recreational opportunities in Charlottesville and Richmond, along with the abundance of natural unspoiled countryside, create an enjoyable setting for a high standard of living among friendly neighbors.
- Interstate 64 intersects the County at its northern tip and runs east-west, providing direct access to Richmond and Hampton Roads. U.S. Route 15, a major north-south highway runs through the center of the County, and State Route 6, runs east-west. Both Interstates 95 and 81 are within 45 minutes of the County.
- Several major universities and two-year institutions, including top-ranked University of Virginia and Piedmont Virginia Community College, are within a 30 minute drive.

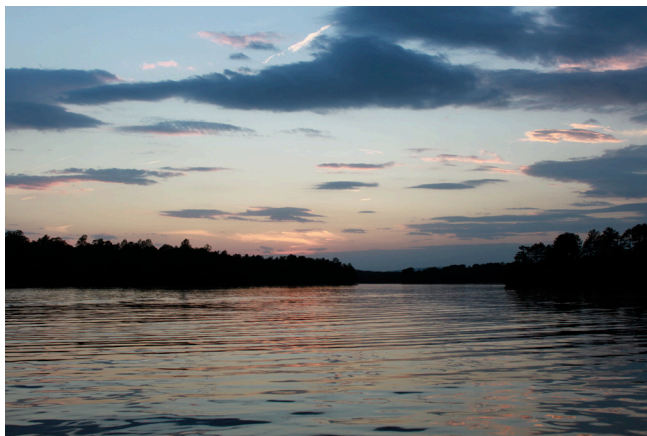
Demographics
